Description

Provide a short description of the event and its activities.

The working team composed of all project partners, following the input of the Opengroup lead beneficiary of this WP, defined together how to reach the objectives of this work package.

The share aim was to train students Roma and non Roma on Holocaust and Roma genocide using participatory methods.

The project partners also shared the possibility of keeping teacher training (wp 14) and didactic workshops (wp 15) interconnected, so that teacher training could provide them with tools to deliver didactic workshops to students on the topic of Porrajmos.

The following table shows the activities carried out by Tracer's partners in Italy (Modena, Florence, Naples), in Poland and in Portugal (Braga and Figueira da Foz).

	<p>The final event took place at the Marchi Forti Institute on the 30th January 2024. The workshop was aimed at making a video using the stop motion technique entitled "Vita da rom". The initial meetings focused on dialogue between the students in form of interviews on the topic of Roma life in Naples and the metropolitan area. The objective was mutual knowledge and the deconstruction of prejudices and stereotypes. The theoretical-practical workshops on interculturalism and storytelling with students from secondary schools continued with other class groups with in-depth meetings on the history of the Roma communities, which we complemented with presentation workshops with theatrical techniques, manual workshops such as bread-making, and the construction of collective cartographies around the topic.</p> <p>30 hours (10 hours per group)</p>	<p>91 participants divided in 3 groups</p> <p>'I.C. At the end of the training, young people had the opportunity to express what they felt and what they learned during the training. From what they wrote and said, what became most evident was the respect for human beings, for each other's culture and for Human Rights.
